Leduc Farmers' Market Rules & Regulations F: by initialing beside each line, you agree to abide by these Rules & Regulations. 1) Vendor approval is at the sole discretion of the Market Manager and the Board of Directors of the Leduc Farmers' Market Association. ____ 2) Approved vendors may only sell approved products at the market. Any changes or additions to products, as described in the application form, must be approved by the market manager in advance of the market day. Used or flea sale items are prohibited. ____ 3) Vendors are accepted into the market using a quota system in order to ensure that there are a variety of products for sale; and that the vendors get an adequate market share. _ 4) Vendors must conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times. Unprofessional conduct such as cleanliness of the vendor, the use of inappropriate language, insubordination, disrespectful behavior, smoking, the consumption of alcohol or drugs, may be cause for immediate dismissal from the market. No warnings or refunds will be given. 5) All vendors must reapply and complete both an application and waiver form annually. Previous participation does not guarantee approval for future market years. 6) All vendors attending the market must pay the annual membership fee. Vendors will not be required to pay the membership fee until they attend the second market. 7) It is mandatory that all vendors carry liability insurance. 8) Market hours are from 10am to 1:30pm on Thursdays and Saturdays. Set up starts at 8:30am. Vendors may not set up unless the manager is on site. All vehicles must be in place by 9:30am. After 9:30 am, no vehicle will be allowed to enter the market site unless they have Manager Approval. 9) No selling prior to 10am without Market Manager Approval. 10) Vendors may not dismantle their stall or leave early. ____ 11) Vendors who have sold out must wait until the market closes before dismantling their stall. A SOLD-OUT sign must be placed on the empty table. 12) The market manager has sole discretion for vendor spacing and placement. Spacing requests may be made to the market manager, but requests will not necessarily be granted. ____ 13) Each vendor is allowed a maximum of 3 stalls, at the discretion of the Market Manager. Approval of additional stalls may be revoked if that space is needed for additional vendors. Any monies paid up front for additional stalls will be returned to the vendor if this scenario occurs.
